<u>School Visit</u>: Scheduled for <u>Friday, January 7</u>, eighth grade students from John Muir, parochial schools and home schoolers will be touring Wausau West and visiting with department leaders of the elective areas. This will provide students the opportunity to ask questions and see what Wausau West High School is like.

8th Grade Student Registration: Counselors will be visiting with John Muir students on Friday, January 7 to explain the registration process. Wausau West Counselors will also visit Horace Mann, Trinity Lutheran, Our Savior's Lutheran, other private schools and home school students during January to assist with registration for eighth graders.

<u>Bth Grade Parents' Night</u>: Parents are invited to meet with department leaders on <u>Monday</u>, <u>January 10</u>, <u>at 7:00 p.m.</u> in the West High Auditorium. This evening is planned to help you assist your son or daughter in course selections. We look forward to meeting you and introducing you to Wausau West High School. After a brief presentation by the elective departments, all department chairs will be available to answer your questions in the commons area.





ADVISOR/ADVISEE Week Monday, February 10, 2022

Advisor/Advisee Night is a time for high school parents and students who are currently in 9th, 10th and 11th grades to meet with their homeroom advisor to discuss goals and finalize course selections. During the week of **January 10**, a message will be sent home to schedule a time to meet between 4:00-8:00 pm on February 7, 2022.

The following questions will help generate discussion with your child prior to this Advisor/Advisee Week:

- 1. Have you signed up for the courses that are required for next year?
- 2. Are you taking elective courses of high interest and rigor appropriate?
- 3. Have you thought about what you would like to do after you graduate?
- 4. If you're thinking of college or technical college, do you know what courses you need to meet admission requirements?
- 5. What courses can you take to help you prepare for your future?
- 6. Have you read the Career Pathway information and course descriptions in the **Career Planning/Course Registration Handbook?**

PLANNING 2022-2023 COURSE REGISTRATION INFORMATION

When planning course registrations for next year, please keep in mind our graduation requirements. Full details are available in the Career Planning and Course Handbook. A few specific reminders follow:

- 1) Required to earn a minimum of three years (three credits) of mathematics.
- 2) Required to earn a minimum of three years (three credits) of science.
- 3) Required to earn a minimum of three and a half years (3.5 credits) of social studies.
- 4) Required to take a financial literacy course which can be fulfilled by any of the following courses:
 - Personal Financial Management Business Education Course
 - Money Matters Family Consumer Sciences Course
 - Economics Social Studies Course
- 5) A Civics test is required in Wisconsin. The social studies teachers will be providing more information in class.

COURSE REGISTRATION MATERIALS

2022-2023 course registration materials will be distributed on Tuesday, January 18. Students will have twenty calendar days to determine their course selections. This process **concludes** on Advisor-Advisee Night, **Monday, February 7.**

COURSE SELECTION 2022-2023

<u>The key to successful course selection begins with thoughtful planning</u>. Parents, please take the opportunity to discuss career/work goals and aspirations with your son or daughter. Consider their interests, talents, and work habits. A visit to our outstanding Career Center can also make this exploration even more meaningful.

Wausau West offers a tremendous variety of course offerings. Please work proactively with your son or daughter to help select courses that support their interests, strengths, and areas of exploration. The Wausau West handbook is a very good resource for information on career planning and course descriptions. Parents and students will receive an electronic copy of this registration handbook during the week of January 4. We will also have this available on our Wausau West website. A limited amount of paper copies of this handbook will also be available in the Counseling office.

It is important to invest careful thought into this process, as later course changes and drops are done only if it meets criteria. Please refer to the registration dates on page 2 of this newsletter.

ACT INFORMATION FOR JUNIORS

Now that our school year is well underway, we thought it important to share an update on the Wisconsin State Assessment Program and how that program affects our juniors. We are sharing this information now to make you aware of our preparations and plans as they relate to the junior assessment, **the ACT exam**, which will be taken in March by all public school juniors in the state of Wisconsin. The ACT has typically been a college admission test for students interested in attending college following their high school career. Though it will still serve students interested in post-secondary education, it will also serve as an accountability measure for Wausau West.

This paper and pencil test will be given on the morning of <u>March 8, 2022</u>. As we near the testing date, additional information will be made available to parents and students about timing, expectations, and preparation for this exam. We have included below, answers to frequently asked questions and the Wausau West ACT test preparation schedule. **FAQ's**

- Is there a cost to parents/families for juniors taking the tests on March 8, 2022? No, the state will be picking up the cost.
- What if my son/daughter already took the ACT, do they still have to take it on March 8? Yes, ALL juniors in the state need to take the ACT test on March 8, 2022. The scores on the March ACT will also be used by each school for accountability purposes.
- If a student chooses to take the test again, can he/she do it for free on the designated make-up day (April 12, 2022)? No, all juniors will be tested only once by statewide testing protocol. If a student wants to re-test, the payment for the test will fall to the family and must be taken on national test dates.
- Can students take the ACT test multiple times? Yes, students can re-test at the family's expense.
- What if my student is ill on March 8, 2022? The make-up date is April 12, 2022.
- Can a student's test score from the <u>March 8, 2022</u> test date be used for college admission? Yes it can, if you are testing under standard test administration or if you are identified as a special education student testing with ACT approved accommodations. Students using accommodations other than ACT approved will not be able to use their scores for college admission.
- Can the student's test score be used for admission into a technical college? Yes. For example, NTC uses
 the ACT scores and if a student has a composite of 18 or higher they will gain acceptance for admission into their
 college.
- What if a student does not plan to go to a 2 or 4 year college, do they still need to take the ACT test? Yes, the March ACT test score will be used for school accountability purposes.
- **How will colleges receive the scores?** When students fill out the pre-test information they will be able to select four colleges to receive their scores. Additionally, colleges will use the students' highest ACT test score.

Can I get more information on what types of questions are on the ACT? Students can go to <u>actstudent.org</u> to find practice questions. There will also be optional (but highly encouraged) subject specific sessions offered throughout the month of January & February to interested students. Additional resources are available on the <u>Counseling website</u>.

Information regarding the student applicant is very pertinent to the committee in their task of scholarship selection. The scholarship committee consists of faculty members and counselors from Wausau West. Scholarships will be based primarily on academics, character, and school involvement.

Scholarships will be presented at the <u>Senior Awards</u> <u>Program on Wednesday, May 18, at 6:30 p.m.</u> in the auditorium.

TECHNOLOGY EDUCATION

The Technology Education Department has recently purchased a portable sawmill to complement the current curricular offerings in both wood manufacturing and building trades. The Woodmizer LT35 portable sawmill will allow the department the ability to produce much of the raw materials used by all levels of woodworking classes including 2x4s for rough wall framing and hardwood lumber for furniture manufacturing. Most of the initial material has come from the Wausau School Forest as they have a regular supply of logs from periodic forest maintenance and storm cleanup. The department has also made initial contacts with the City of Wausau and Marathon County Parks and their urban forestry department. Logs that would have otherwise been sold for pulp or cut into firewood can now be donated to the school for milling and use in department classes. The Technology Education Department is very excited to add this piece of equipment as a valuable experience for the students of Wausau West.



COURSE CHANGES ON THE HORIZON FOR THE TECHNOLOGY & ENGINEERING ED. DEPARTMENT


The Wausau West Technology and Engineering Education Department provides a variety of rigorous and relevant course offerings in metal and wood manufacturing, graphic design and engineering. These courses consistently enjoy high student participation and offer a number of hands-on project based activities. However, in effort to provide experiences that will set students up for success beyond high school, the department is exploring course revision options for the coming school year. Throughout the past two years, and due in large part to the interruptions caused by the COVID pandemic, there has been an overwhelming emphasis by industry to incorporate automation robotics and "Smart" machines in their operations. Whether it be the inability to hire enough qualified workers, the need for improved repeatability, accuracy and precision or an increase in order volume, for a company to remain competitive, they must be looking towards automating their processes. Because this is the new employment environment that students will be entering, the Technology Education Department will be adding opportunities in Mechatronics, Robotics Programming and Digital Manufacturing. The current year-long class "Introduction to In Design" will be modified slightly to become two - semester long classes "Introduction to Engineering Design and Manufacturing/Fab Lab 1" and "Introduction to Engineering Design and Automation/Fab Lab 2." The current year-long "Computer Integrated Manufacturing" will become two - semester long classes "Introduction to Mechatronic" and "Introduction to Robotics Programming." 


WARRIOR GIRLS CROSS COUNTRY TEAM WINS CONFERENCE TITLE!

DECA prepares students to be academically prepared, community oriented and professionally responsible experienced leaders. Our ninth annual Trick or Can event on Halloween was an amazing success with 80 DECA members participating in this event giving back to the Wausau community.
