NOTES FROM THE SENIOR MEETING

There will be approximately five senior meetings this year. The first one was held on September 2nd. We discussed information that relates to your students' senior year and what needs to be done in order to graduate in May. Most meetings will be in the auditorium. Announcements will be made as the date gets closer.

- It is the student's job to ensure they graduate. We are here to assist you, yet if your student ignores what needs to be done (come to school, do homework, study for tests, etc.) they may not pass their required classes. Please contact us if you have concerns, or see your student's counselor for a credit check.
- Credit check forms were sent to your homes in July and may have caused some confusion. See your counselor if you didn't get one or don't know where you stand.
- Please check your school email! This is how we communicate importation information!
- Also check your:
 - [Wausau West Counseling](#) webpage under the Student Services tab on the West website. On this website you will see: [ACT Registration/Prep](#), Transcript and ACT ordering, UW/NTC applications, and scholarship information.
 - College accounts at each individual school.
- Each year some students who have fulfilled all the graduation requirements by the end of the first semester want to graduate early. If your student has thoughts of graduating after the first semester, see your counselor. Applications are due by December 1st.
- This year will have many due dates and that can add a lot of stress! Remember to have your student pace themselves and talk about the stress. They are NOT alone in feeling this way. We are here to help you!

Applications

Students planning on attending two or four-year college campuses should start working on their applications now. Once completed, double check your application status to make sure the colleges have received all of your materials. Missing even one item can hold up the review process. If you need assistance completing applications please come into the Counseling Office or Career Center right away.

Accepted to College or University

Attention Seniors: If you have been accepted to a college or university, this acceptance is partially dependent on the classes you have selected to take your final year in high school. Therefore, if you must change your second semester schedule, **you need to first check with the admissions office of the college you plan to attend to receive their approval of your change.** To do so without checking could jeopardize your admission.

Mid-Term Grads

If your student is planning on graduating at mid-term, he/she must do the following before December 1, 2022:

- See their counselor to verify credit status.
- Pick up an Early Graduation Request form from the Counseling Office and return the completed form with additional documentation to Mr. Kelter before the deadline of **December 1, 2022.**

FAFSA

FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) opens October 1, 2022.

[College Goal Wisconsin](#) is affiliated with a national event that provides free information and assistance to families who need to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®), the federally required form for students seeking financial aid such as grants and loans. Completing the FAFSA is the first and most important step in qualifying for aid to help pay for college. If interested in attending, families need to register for this event and make sure the student and one parent have their FSA ID created prior to the event. Please reference the West Counseling Website to learn how to create your FSA ID.

Scholarship Information



College education is expensive, however, financial help is available in the form of scholarships. To date, the Counseling Office has posted numerous scholarship opportunities available to seniors. Check the Counseling Office for detailed information. Scholarship information is also available on the West webpage at: west.wausauschools.org under the Student Services tab.

Remember scholarships and other free money is very competitive. Once you have completed your admission applications start applying for scholarships. Check the Wausau West Counseling webpage scholarship section. Some of the scholarships require recommendation letters and essays. Plan accordingly and start working on them early.

Any senior still undecided on their next path after high school should set up a meeting with their parents and counselor as soon as possible.

NCAA Clearing House-Attention Division I and II Prospective College Athletes

If you are a senior planning to participate in Division I or II sports as a college freshman, now is the time to register and be certified by the NCAA Eligibility Center. **It is the student's responsibility to research college athletic programs and carefully check and understand NCAA requirements.** Since only approved Wausau West High School core coursework will be considered for eligibility, it is imperative that students take the appropriate courses prior to graduation. The approved list can be obtained by visiting the NCAA Eligibility website. The **Wausau West school code is 502-417**. The NCAA Eligibility Center website provides information on eligibility standards, financial aid, recruiting and the national letter of intent, in addition to other topics of interest to student athletes. It will also provide information regarding NCAA guidelines and the changes regarding the increased number of required approved core courses students in high school must complete.

Juniors

NOTE: This will be held during Parent-Teacher Conference Day, so please schedule your conference with the Junior Parent Meeting in mind.

It's time to start thinking about, and actively planning your post secondary plans. Options include employment, military, trade or technical college, two or four-year university/college. **This is a very important year for planning purposes.** Those who have decided college, or technical college, the next step is to do "official" campus visits. Contact information is listed on the [Wausau West Counseling webpage](#). Campus visit opportunities are also posted in the cabinet outside of the Counseling Office. Visit as many campuses as possible. Take notes on what you like and dislike about every campus you visit. This will assist you in making decisions about college choices. Also, come and listen to representatives during college visiting days. Before a campus tour or college visit, remember to pick up a question sheet from the Counseling Office. You can always ask college representatives the questions during your tour.

Students planning on entering the workforce or the military should be talking with their parents and meeting with employers or recruiters as soon as possible.

College Credit Programs Early College Credit Program/Start College Now

Interested in taking classes at UW-Stevens Point, Wausau Campus with the Early College Credit Program or Northcentral Technical College with the Start College Now Program while still a high school student? Please visit the [Wausau West Counseling website](#) for the appropriate application and eligibility information, and see your counselor for more information or clarification. Students must be in strong academic standing, and on track with West's graduation requirements. Both programs have strict application deadlines, and eligibility requirements. Not all students will qualify.

Career Center

STUDENTS, CHECK YOUR EMAIL! Students are encouraged to check their Wausau School District email regularly to stay up-to-date on happenings in the Career Center. College, military, and community organization visitors will be announced via email and announcements. Additionally, job and volunteer opportunities and field trip announcements may also be sent via email. Announcements are also posted on the TV messaging system.

COLLEGE & MILITARY VISITS: Representatives from colleges, universities, and the military will visit the Career Center throughout the year. Students should watch for advertisements and emails to learn when representatives will be in the Career Center, and make it a point to stop by the Career Center to learn more about their post-secondary options.

ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery): Will be offered at Wausau West to any interested junior or senior. The ASVAB is a voluntary, free career aptitude test designed for students who plan to enter the military upon graduation, or for students who simply want to learn how their skills and interest match hundreds of occupations. The ASVAB is a three-hour test. The date will be announced by October 1 along with the registration deadline. If you have questions, see Ms. Pickar in the Career Center.

SELECTIVE SERVICE: All male students must register with the Selective Service within 30 days of their 18th birthday. Students may register as early as three months after their 17th birthday. This is not a school requirement, it's the law. Failure to register will affect a student's ability to receive financial aid, job training, or gain citizenship. Registering with Selective Service is easy and only takes about two minutes. Visit Ms. Pickar in the Career Center, go online at www.sss.gov, or pick up a registration card in the Career Center or at any post office.

AP Registration Timelines 2022-2023

PLEASE READ IF TAKING AN AP CLASS THIS YEAR

The following is a timeline of events that AP students should follow in order to participate in AP Testing in the spring. The cost will be \$100/exam if registered by November 1, 2022. Late registrations can be completed until March 14, 2023 with an additional \$40 late fee (\$140/exam).

- **Now** - students create a College Board account (myap.collegeboard.org) for access to curriculum materials and test questions throughout the school year
- **September 16 - November 1, 2022** - Students must register and pay for AP exams through Total Registration to avoid late fees
- **January 18, 2023** - Last day to request testing accommodations through the College Board
- **February 1 - March 1, 2023** - Students register and pay for 2nd semester classes (AP English Literature, AP Macroeconomics) through Total Registration
- **March 14, 2023** - Last day to register and pay in full for a year-long course with a \$40 late fee (\$140)
- **May 1 - 12, 2023** - AP testing. Schedule can be found here
- **July 2023** - Students access test scores through their College Board account

STUDENTS WILL BE ACCESSING AND UTILIZING TWO DIFFERENT WEBSITES FOR THEIR AP JOURNEY!

Step 1: COLLEGE BOARD



- myap.collegeboard.org
- Create a student account at the beginning of the school year
- Use Join Code from AP teacher to enroll in your class
- Receive activities, formatives, and practice tests assigned by AP teachers
- Designate whether you will be taking the AP test or not
- Information entered will produce a unique AP ID label sheet that will be used on exam materials
- In Summer 2023, students request free exam reports be sent to colleges
- In July 2023, students will log into their College Board account to see AP test results

Step 2: TOTAL REGISTRATION



- totalregistration.net
- Create a Total Registration account which includes parent information
- Register and pay for AP exams here
- Receive administrative emails and texts sent to both parents and students regarding testing details, fees, etc.
- To avoid a late fee, students in full-year classes will register and pay in full (\$100/exam) by November 1, 2022
- Registration for full-year classes can be done up to March 14th with a \$40 late fee for a total of \$100 + \$40 per test

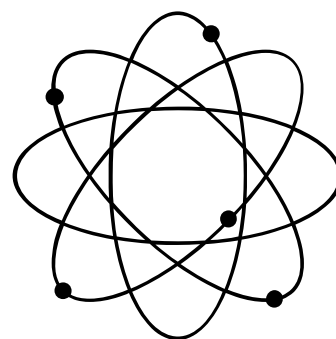
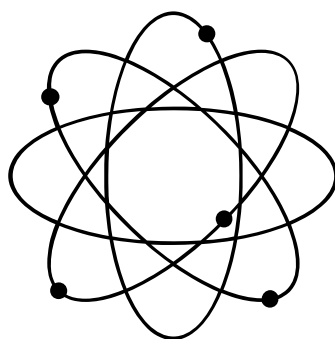
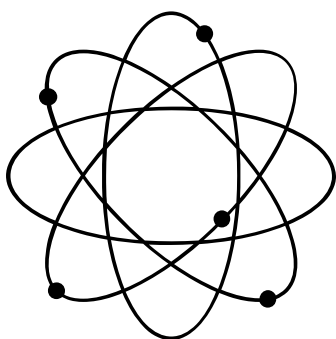
Wausau West Science Olympiad

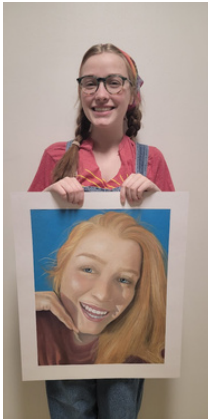

Wausau West Library



The library main webpage is <https://sites.google.com/wausauschools.org/wausauwest/home>. Look at the top of the resource pages for at-home use passwords link. We also use soraapp.com for our Overdrive collection of e-books and digital audio books. To access the books, students log in with their school computer user name and password. This can be done on any device with a Chrome browser.

The library maintains a West Library Canvas course. Students have access to short tutorials for projects and resources, find links to all our resources with passwords and research guides. Students have access to this course thru their Canvas accounts.

The physical library is open during school hours. Students are welcome to come and work during unscheduled mods on any assignment, check out materials, or work on provided activities. There are small group rooms available for students to use for academic needs such as recording, practicing speeches, or small group projects. They can check these rooms out with the staff.

Attendance Updates

Students NEED to sign IN and OUT at the Attendance Window when they are arriving late to school (after 7:45 am) and leaving early from school (before 3:00 pm). Including using your off campus privileges.

Communication between home and school is of utmost importance for the Attendance Office. The following is a list of acceptable reasons your student may miss school:

- Personal illness
- Funerals and religious services as requested by the parent(s) and/or guardian(s)
- Professional appointments that could not be scheduled outside of the regular school day
- Serious personal or family crisis
- Student is not in proper physical and/or mental condition to attend school in accordance with Wisconsin Statute 118.15(3)(a)
- Suspension from school

Students will be excused for the above reasons only when a parent/guardian gives an explanation of the cause of the absence. Please call the Attendance Office by 9:30 a.m. on the day of the absence. If this is impossible, please call or send a note with your child on the day of his/her return to school.

Parents/guardians are allowed to excuse their child for part of, or the entirety of, ten days per school year without a medical note. If your child is absent from school for more than ten days, you will be asked to furnish a medical excuse. Absences excused with medical notes are excused without using the ten days previously mentioned. Family vacations or activities must be pre-arranged through the Attendance Office prior to leaving. In such cases, the student must complete an Anticipated Absence form.





NUTRITION SERVICES UPDATES: IMPORTANT DATE TO REMEMBER

Students who qualified for Free or Reduced meals from the previous school year (2021-2022) based on an income application, should check to be sure that their parent/guardian has completed a new meal application for the current school year. The 30 day carry over period or “roll-over” for meal eligibility is set to expires on Oct 13, 2022. After that date, any student(s) who is currently receiving FREE OR REDUCED meals based on an income application from LAST SCHOOL YEAR, will become full pay if no current meal application is approved and on file. See [Paypams \(www.paypams.com/onlineapp\)](http://www.paypams.com/onlineapp) to complete an online meal application to see if you qualify for FREE or REDUCED Meals.

Negative Meal Accounts

- School Messenger messages will be sent out to all households to let you know if your child’s meal account balance is negative. Please send money with your child in a prepayment envelope that includes your child’s name. This envelope can be given to the kitchen staff at your child’s school. Parents may visit www.Paypams.com to create an online account for your child where you can add money to their meal account using a credit card as well as view purchases made.
- Middle School and High School: Ala carte privileges are suspended once the meal account goes negative, a reimbursable meal only may be charged on a negative account, until the account reaches a negative \$20.00; at which time the student will need to bring a cold lunch meal from home until the negative balance is corrected or cash is brought in to pay for the hot lunch meal that day. No student eligible for a free or reduced meal may be denied a lunch, even if the student has a negative account balance greater than negative \$20.
