Dear Parents and Guardians,



What You Need to Know About Student Fees for West High School Students

New this year we are accepting debit/credit cards, as well as cash and checks for payments. There will be an additional fee of \$2.00 to use your credit/debit card.

All students attending West High School will be required to pay the class fees. Students and parents should be aware that some courses have additional fees. If a financial hardship exists alternative arrangements can be made during Schedule Pick Up with, Associate Principal, Jon Tomski, in room 183.

SPORTS FEES

The \$50.00 User Fee, per sport, must be paid before the athlete can compete with the exception of Boys Lacrosse which is \$75.00. A free/reduced user fee rate of \$25.00 will be offered to students based on the free/reduced hot lunch eligibility criteria.

FIRST DAY SCHEDULE FOR FRESHMEN

On September 1, incoming freshmen will begin with homeroom and they will participate in our "Link Crew" orientation at Wausau West High School. This orientation is a fun, fast-paced way for students to become familiar with people and programs that make Wausau West great. During the freshman orientation, students will be involved in a variety of activities with their classmates and link crew leaders. The tentative schedule is as follows:



- 7:45 a.m. Freshmen report to homeroom for locker assignment, instructions and updates, etc.
 8:30 a.m. Freshmen and link leaders report to the auditorium for orientation 11:15 a.m. Link leaders take freshmen to the fieldhouse for conflict resolution 12:00 p.m. LUNCH
- 1:00 p.m. Modified schedules/tours of the building
- 3:00 p.m. Dismissal

FIRST DAY SCHEDULE FOR SOPHOMORES, JUNIORS, AND SENIORS

- 7:45 a.m. Sophomores, juniors, & seniors, report to homeroom for locker assignment, updates, etc. After homeroom, a Link Crew orientation will be held for upperclassmen new to West.
- 8:30 a.m. Conflict Resolution begins in the fieldhouse for sophomores, juniors and seniors. Once students have taken care of their conflicts they will be excused for the day. **Students are expected to take care of any conflict or "no lunch" scenario on this day.**



"Warrior Days"

We have a lot of things going on at Wausau West and in order to cater to those differing needs we will be implementing what we are calling "Warrior Days" at various points throughout the school year. "Warrior Days" will take place on school days that fall at an 'odd' time on the school calendar or on days that have an atypical schedule due to an early release, assembly, or conflict resolution.

All classes will be canceled on Warrior Days. Rather than attending class, students will have extended homerooms during which they will take part in activities and learning centered around Leader in Me as well as Academic and Career Planning. After the extended homeroom, students will participate in various school culturebuilding activities such as school assemblies, guest speakers, class meetings, and activities/volunteer fairs. Our first three Warrior Days will take place on September 2nd (second day of school), October 7th (Homecoming), and October 26th (Parent/Teacher Conferences).

<u>Student attendance is mandatory and will be recorded</u>. We are excited for these new activities and their ability to offer unique learning experiences to our students.

"Student Parking"

The City of Wausau has updated their parking enforcement processes which has in-turn prompted us to update our parking processes. Students will still need to pay \$40 for a school-year parking pass and \$20 for a semester pass. However, we will no longer be issuing physical parking tags to be placed in vehicles. Instead, students purchasing a parking pass will be asked to submit the vehicle information on the vehicle or vehicles they will be parking in our lot. This information will be submitted to the Wausau Parking Enforcement's database and used by their new license-plate scanning technology. The new technology will scan license plates in our parking lot as parking enforcement drives through and flag any plates that are not in the database. Any license plate that is flagged will be issued a parking citation.

<u>"Canvas"</u>

This year Wausau West will be changing learning management systems from ItsLearning to Canvas. This move was prompted when ItsLearning notified the district that they will no longer be servicing and supporting their platform in the United States. Schools within Wausau School District were given the option to transition from ItsLearning to Canvas by the end of the 22-23 school year as they saw fit. Here at West, we decided to fully adopt Canvas at the beginning of this school year for all students and staff in an effort to speed-up the transition process and help eliminate confusion for students who may have otherwise had to use both platforms throughout the year. Staff have been training to use Canvas throughout summer and will be ready to roll out their classes on the new platform by the start of school.

STUDENT INFORMATION



IMPORTANT POLICIES/PROCEDURES FROM THE ATTENDANCE OFFICE

Communication between home and school is of utmost importance for the Attendance Office. The following is a list of acceptable reasons your student may miss school:

- * Personal illness
- * Funerals and religious services as requested by the parent(s) and/or guardian(s)
- * Professional appointments that could not be scheduled outside of the regular school day
- * Serious personal or family crisis
- * Student is not in proper physical and/or mental condition to attend school in accordance with Wisconsin Staute118.15(3)(a)
- * Suspension from school

Students will be excused for the above reasons only when a parent/guardian gives an explanation of the cause of the absence. Please call the Attendance Office by 9:30 a.m. on the day of the absence. If this is impossible, please call or send a note with your child on the day of his/her return to school.

Parents/guardians are allowed to excuse their child for part of or the entirety of ten days per school year without a medical note. If your child is absent from school for more than ten days, you will be asked to furnish a medical excuse. Absences excused with medical notes are excused without using the ten days previously mentioned. Family vacations or activities must be pre-arranged through the Attendance Office prior to leaving. In such cases, the student must complete an anticipated absence form.

CLOSED CAMPUS AND OPEN CAMPUS INCENTIVE

Seniors, juniors, and 2nd semester sophomores meeting the below criteria will be eligible to leave campus for all unstructured mods starting at lunch (Mod 9) through the end of the school day. The criteria to earn this privilege includes:

- 1. Parental permission on file
- 2. Passing grades
- 3. Good attendance, including Homeroom
- 4. Good behavior

Details of this list of conditions can be found in the student handbook which will be available on our website and will be saved to your child's Chromebook. Students will be issued an application during homeroom and can submit them to the Attendance Office. Qualifying students will be allowed to use this privilege after the 10th day of school. Students qualifying who are found to have attendance and behavior concerns will have this privilege revoked. Students using this privilege must leave school property, loitering in the parking lot is not allowed and will result in revocation of the privilege and possibly a citation from the Wausau Police Department. We strongly urge parents to discuss this policy with your students in hopes that we can have efficient implementation of these rules.

Illness at School

Students who become ill during school hours must report to the Health Office **before** leaving the building. Students **may not** call parents from their classrooms or use cell phones.

Emergency and Medical Information Form – All students are required to have a signed form on file for permission to act in case of an emergency.

<u>Online registration forms</u>, which are available in your parent portal (formally known as Census Verification sheets) will be available during Schedule Pick Up for you to update if you have not already completed them online.

- · Please include all health information pertinent to the care of your child during school hours.
- Please list emergency contacts that live in the area and can pick up your child from school in case of an illness or injury.
- Please inform the school of any changes that may occur during the school year so this information will remain current.

<u>Prescription Medication Administered at School</u> – Prior to administrating, students must have written instructions along with *practitioner and parent/guardian* signatures on the Wausau School District <u>Medication</u> <u>Consent Form</u>. The medication needs to arrive in its original container. All medications are kept locked in the Health Office. Students may carry and self-administer inhalers, EpiPens or insulin when practitioner and parent/ guardian give consent on the medication form. Any medication remaining at the end of the school year must be picked up by parent/guardian.

Non-prescription Medication Administered at School – Prior to administrating, students must have written instructions and a *parent/guardian* signature on the Wausau School District <u>Medication Consent Form</u> (If dose exceeds the standard on the label a practitioner signature will also be required). The medication needs to arrive in its original container. All medications are kept locked in the Health Office. Any medication remaining at the end of the school year must be picked up by parent/guardian. Students may carry and self-administer cough drops/throat lozenges, lip balms or sunscreens (no form needed).

**Acetaminophen or Ibuprofen can be provided by the Health Office if an Acetaminophen/Ibuprofen Consent Form is signed by the parents.

Please have your child vaccinated before school starts in the fall if he/she has not already received the required vaccine(s). Vaccines are available from your child's physician or the <u>Marathon County Health Department</u>.

COUNSELING INFORMATION

"College Bound"? Admission Tests are Required for College Admission

College admission tests are one of the requirements when applying to a college or university. Both the ACT (American



College Test) and the SAT (Scholastic Aptitude Test) are admission tests. A student may choose to take one or both of these assessments, or choose to no t have their score included. However, it should be noted that the University of Wisconsin System has historically preferred scores from the ACT assessment as part of its entrance requirements, but due to Covid this is now and optional component. Also, to qualify for some scholarships a student may be required to submit an ACT or SAT score.

Students may register for either test online at the address below or using the registration materials they can pick up in the Counseling Office.

A few important facts about these tests that may be helpful for you to know: The ACT has an **optional** writing test. It is important for students to check online at <u>actstudent.org</u> prior to registering to take the test, to see if the college(s) they plan on applying to requires the writing test. Not all schools require this test. The SAT also has a writing section to its test, however it is included as part of the test and all students who take the SAT will take the writing component. Both testing companies indicate that applying online expedites registration for the test.

ATTENTION PARENTS OF JUNIORS

The **PSAT/NMSQT®** exam will be offered at Wausau West on Wednesday, October 12, 2022 beginning at 8:00 am. Students may sign up in the Business Office, or online via the Parent Portal with a credit card <u>by September 13th</u>. The cost of the test is \$19. The purpose of the PSAT (practice SAT) is to give students an opportunity to experience taking a college readiness test and to identify students who might benefit from advanced coursework.

By taking the PSAT in 11[®] grade, all students have the opportunity to qualify for participation in the National Merit Scholarship Program. PSAT/NMSQT® scores are used as the initial screen of entrants to the National Merit Scholarship Program, which recognizes outstanding academic achievement by U.S. high school students.



Students must be in good academic standing, have good attendance, and take responsibility to arrange missed work and class time from taking the test on October 12th.

CAREER CENTER

Students, check your email! Students are encouraged to check their Wausau School District email regularly to stay upto-date on happenings in the Career Center. College, military and community organization visitors will be announced via email. Additionally, job and volunteer opportunities and field trip announcements may also be sent via email. Announcements are also posted on the TV messaging system.

College and Military Visits - Representatives from colleges, universities and the military will visit the Career Center throughout the year. Students should watch for advertisements and emails and make a point to stop by the Career Center to meet with a rep and learn more about their post-secondary options.

ASVAB - The ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery) will be offered at Wausau West to any interested junior or senior, The ASVAB is a voluntary, free career aptitude test designed for students who plan to enter the military upon graduation or for students who simply want to learn how their skills and interests match hundreds of occupations. The ASVAB is a three-hour test. The date will be announced by October 1 along with the registration deadline. If you have questions, see Ms. Pickar in the Career Center.

Selective Service - All males must register with Selective Service within 30 days of their 18th birthday. Students may register as early as three months after their 17th birthday. This is not a school requirement; it is the law. Failure to register will affect a student's ability to receive financial aid, job training or to gain citizenship. Registering with Selective Service is easy and only takes about two minutes. Go online at <u>www.sss.gov</u> or pick up a registration card in the Career Center or at any post office.

A PATH TO SUCCESS FOR AP STUDENTS

High school students across the country and around the world take AP courses and exams to challenge themselves, explore their interests, and earn college credit and placement. A study published by the U.S. Department of Education, *Answers in the Toolbox,* shows that the most powerful predictor of college graduation is the rigor of a student's high school curriculum.

If your child is enrolled in an AP level class, they will be asked to create a College Board account in the fall. This will allow access to online resources and to register for the spring AP exam. **Testing will take place in early May 2023.** Cost for the exams are:
