Dear Parents/Guardians,

It is hard to believe we are already into the second semester. The first half of the year has flown by and I suspect the second half will go by equally as fast. Without question, this has been a challenging time for our students; however, their resolve has been impressive and inspiring. As we begin this new semester, I would like to encourage you to continue your involvement in your child's education. We are hoping for your support in helping our students with work completion and meeting learning expectations. - West Referendum Proposed Upgrades More information will be coming in the form of district mailers, advertisements, and open meetings.
- West Graduation Date TBD we have discovered a schedule conflict and are in the process of finding a new date. We will communicate the new date very soon.

On Tuesday, April 5, 2022, residents of the Wausau School District will vote on a referendum question.

If approved by voters, the \$119,800,000 million referendum would lower the tax levy, while at the same time allow the district to address its most pressing facility needs. The district would move forward with safety & security improvements at all elementary schools, as well as, adding additional classroom space at Stettin, South Mountain, and Riverview elementary schools to address increasing enrollment and alleviate capacity concerns. The district is also moving forward with all work at its middle and high schools; addressing deferred maintenance and safety and security needs there. It will also make facility improvements at the Wausau School Forest, including a new Environmental Learning Center.

An approved referendum would have an estimated property tax impact of negative \$0.43 on every \$1,000 of property value in the school district. The owner of a home valued at \$150,000 would see an annual tax reduction of about \$64.50.

The solution the Board of Education is presenting on April 5 was created based on the input and feedback of our community. This effort included online surveys for community and staff members, three community engagement sessions, staff listening sessions at all schools, and engagement on social media. We have also communicated and gathered feedback through a facility needs webpage and via the local media.

We invite you to learn more about our district's needs, how the board developed the proposed solution, and the question that will appear on the April 5 ballot at <u>wausauschools.org</u>.

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# IMPORTANT POLICIES/PROCEDURES FROM THE ATTENDANCE OFFICE

Communication between home and school is of the utmost importance for the Attendance Office. The following is a list of acceptable reasons your student may miss school:

- Personal illness
- Funerals and religious services as requested by the parent(s) and/or guardian(s)
- Professional appointments that could not be scheduled outside of the regular school day
- Serious personal or family crisis
- Student is not in proper physical and/or mental condition to attend school in accordance with the Wisconsin Statute 118.15(3)(a)
- Suspension from school

Students will be excused for the above reasons only when a parent/guardian gives an explanation of the cause of the absence. Please call the Attendance Office by 9:30 a.m. on the day of the absence. If this is impossible, please call or send a note with your child on the day of his/her return to school.

Parents/guardians are allowed to excuse their child for part of or the entirety of ten days per school year without a medical note. If you child is absent from school for more than ten days, you will be asked to furnish a medical excuse. Absences excused with medical notes are excused without using the ten days previously mentioned. Family vacations or activities must be pre-arranged through the Attendance Office prior to leaving. In such cases, the student must complete an anticipated absence form.

If your child needs to leave school during the day, they must obtain a pass from the Attendance Office before leaving. Therefore, you must send a note with your child or call the Attendance Office. Any student who does not obtain a pass before leaving will be marked unexcused. Do not hesitate to contact the Attendance Office at 715-261-0880 with any questions or concerns.

OPEN CAMPUS PRIVILEGES

Seniors, juniors, and **2nd semester sophomores** meeting the below criteria will be eligible to leave campus for all unstructured mods starting at lunch (Mod 9) through the end of the school day. This is a change from past years which only allowed for a 40 minute block of open campus for upperclassmen. The criteria to earn this privilege includes:

- 1. Parental permission on file
- 2. Passing grades

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- 3. Good attendance, including Homeroom
- 4. Good behavior

Students inter-1 ested must pickup and complete an application, which can be found in the main office, attend-1 ■ ance office, or attendance window. Students gualifying who are found to have attendance and I behavior concerns will have this privilege revoked. Students using this privilege must leave 1 school property, loitering in the parking lots is not allowed and will result in revocation of the privi-lege and possibly a citation from the Wausau Police Department. AD Miller here! Our winter sports are in full swing with the tournament series coming just around the corner. It has been good to have our facilities full again with Warrior spectators. So many of our community members were unable to watch our winter sports last year due to restrictions on allowed spectators.

Curling, Cheer, E-Sports, Alpine Ski, Wrestling, Girls Basketball, Boys Basketball, Girls Hockey, and Boys Hockey are having success as we roll through the schedule. You can keep track of our teams by checking the WVC Statistics site at <u>http://www.valleystats.org/</u>.

A couple of highlights are the conference-leading Girls Basketball team (6-0 conference and 12-3 overall). The Wrestling team is currently ranked 9<sup>th</sup> in the state and captured the 25 teams Fond Du Lac Invitational in December. The Cheer team placed as Grand Champions at the January's competition at UWSP. E-Sports will be competing in the E-sports state championship later this winter. - If you have other commitments such as athletics or clubs, please inform your coach or advisor that you may be late in attending practice or your meeting.
- Prior to your exam(s) get a good night's rest and eat a nutritious breakfast.
- Bring a sweater or sweatshirt to the exam in case the room temperature is below your comfort level.
